

# Citylight Summer Internship FAQ's

Q: How long is the Program?

A: Our Summer internship takes place for 10 weeks starting in May and ending in August.

Q: Where is the program located?

A: We are located in Falls Church, VA which falls in the Northern Virginia DC area.

Q: Will housing be provided?

A: Yes, housing as well as food will be provided.

Q: Do I need to have my own mode of transportation?

A: While it is helpful and recommended that you may have your own vehicle, it is not required.

Q: Is there a limit on how many people will get accepted into the program?

A: Yes, as of right now we are only accepting up to 10 students into the program. Each applicant will go through an application process and will make a decision based off of who we believe will be the best fit for the program.

Q: Can I have a part time job while I do this program?

A: No, unfortunately we need your full time and attention, therefore we ask that if you commit to the program that it be your one and only job.

Q: Is School Credit available with this program?

A: Yes, we will partner with your school to help meet your school requirements.

Q: Is there an age limit on the program?

A: Our internship is open to anyone from the age of 18-35.

Q: Is the Internship paid?

A: Yes, all students will receive a \$1000 stipend at the end of Summer as long as they followed through and faithfully completed their commitment to Citylight Church. You also receive payment in the form of housing and free food.

Q: How is my time spent in the program? What will I be doing?

A: The Citylight Summer Internship is split two ways through daily Bible teachings and hands on Church ministry. Our interns go through a 10 training of the core values that we stand by here at Citylight (can be found on Citylight website) while for the ministry portion is spent meeting whatever needs may be present at that time within the church. Our church is a very outreach centered church, so you might also be asked to participate in various outreach events as well. We ask that our interns be flexible, as they will be wearing very many different hats.
